The young women of Parcelles Assainies, an ethnically diverse suburb of Dakar in Senegal have begun an important journey. These local women are benefitting from the instruction received at the *Frances Schervier Formation Center*, a wonderful program started twenty two years ago by the Franciscan Sisters of the Poor, in an effort to provide them a better future.

The Center's program develops activities for social, cultural and religious formation. Each year the Center serves about 100 students aged 15-25 and most come from families with no resources. Participants receive instruction in cutting, sewing, dyeing, cooking, painting, embroidery and crocheting. Additionally, there are programs in literacy (English and French) and health. They learn about AIDS, sexually transmitted diseases, precocious pregnancies, abuse of women and other dangers to which they are all too often exposed. Young women regardless of race or religion are welcome. A well-rounded education is received and they leave with a sense of dignity and self-worth. Formation lasts four years and a government accepted diploma is issued upon course completion.

The Sisters have asked the Foundation for \$5,000 to purchase 30 new sewing machines for the school. We are asking **YOU**, our generous benefactors, to contribute toward this worthy goal.

For less than \$200 per machine, we can help young women work their way out of poverty and on the path to a brighter future!!
